




For many years Ignatius patiently encouraged Francis to give up his pride and ambition. Eventually the two friends both become great missionaries.

These brothers were among the first twelve apostles, and were two of Jesus' closest friends. Jesus nicknamed them the "Sons of Thunder."




As a youth he gave his mother a lot of heartache, but, eventually, through her tears and prayers, he was converted and became a great theologian.




Ss. Paul and Barnabas were friends who worked together to spread Christianity in its early days. Sometimes they disagreed on exactly how to do it.




Jesus chose her to spread a devotion to His Sacred Heart, but no one believed she was telling the truth, except her confessor and friend.




These twins knew from an early age that they wanted to devote their lives to God. They founded religious orders, and met each year to reminisce.




Both Carmelites in Spain in the 16th century, these friends worked together to return their religious communities to a life of prayer.
